Natural beauty and an assortment of marine wildlife offer an unparalleled ambience from internationally renowned salmon fishing to skiing at nearby Mount Washington. A metropolitan town located on the edge of the BC wilderness, a region rich in natural resources. Massive runs of salmon head up the Campbell River on Vancouver Island to their freshwater spawning grounds, including Coho, Steelhead, Chum, Chinook and Pink salmon.
